Željko Rišner was born on November 1, 1962 in Osijek, where he acquired his primary and secondary education. He graduated from the Faculty of Pedagogy of the University of Josip Juraj Strossmayer in 1989 and earned the title of Professor of English and German Language and Literature. As an external associate, he taught English at the Faculty of Civil Engineering in Osijek, and from 1992 to 1994, also as an external associate, English and German at the Faculty of Law in Osijek. Since 1994, he has been permanently employed at the Faculty of Law, first as a lecturer and then as a senior lecturer. He teaches the compulsory courses English Language I and II at the Integrated Undergraduate and Graduate University Study of Law and at the Professional Study of Law. He also teaches English for EU Law as an elective course (5th year) at the Integrated University Study. Before moving to the Bologna System, he taught elective courses English for Lawyers I (in the third year of study) and English for Lawyers II (in the fourth year of study). Furthermore, he taught English I, II, III and IV at polytechnics in Požega, Vukovar and Petrinja at dislocated professional studies of the Osijek Faculty of Law. Since its beginning in 2012, he has been participating in the Lifelong Education Programme for Lawyers-Linguists as the holder of two courses. At the University Study of Culture, he has taught the courses German language I, II, III, IV, V and VI from the establishment of that study programme in 2009 until 2020. He has participated as presenter at several national and international scientific conferences. He published more than twenty scientific and professional papers, as well as a number of translations. He also wrote the book Neki drugi pisci essekerski (Some Other Esseker Writers) about the literary production in the German language in Osijek in the early 20th century, which was published in 1999. He was co-mentor on several graduate papers at the Faculty of Law Osijek. He collaborated on the projects "Right of construction - a factor of easing the housing crisis" and "Germans and Austrians and German language and culture in the city of Osijek throughout history - legal and linguistic aspects (IP-PRAVOS-20) at the Faculty of Law in Osijek and "Shaping and reshaping the organization of construction companies" at the Faculty of Civil Engineering in Osijek. He is member of the Croatian Applied Linguistics Society (CALS) and of the Association of LSP Teachers at Higher Education Institutions.
