## Brussels, 13 and 14 March 2025

The <u>UNIPAR project</u> investigates the lack of EU rules on the law applicable to parenthood/filiation. The European Commission published a proposal for such rules on 7 December 2022 (<u>COM/2022/695</u>). The proposal contains rules on jurisdiction, applicable law, recognition, enforcement and cooperation in matters regarding parenthood/filiation. The proposal has not yet been passed by the other legislative bodies, and since unanimity is required in the Council to pass this Regulation, its future is uncertain. In the current state of affairs, UNIPAR not only analyses the proposed rules, but also considers the impact that EU rules on parenthood/filiation would have on existing EU legislation. It also investigates national laws on artificial reproduction as related to private international law, as well as aspects of children's rights.
