In this course, students gain knowledge of legal instruments and a methodological approach to the study of European law in family matters. The course is aimed at providing specific knowledge of the normative action of the Council of Europe and the European Union in the regulation of family relations, and critical analysis of the relevant case law of the European Court of Human Rights and the Court of Justice of the European Union. Although substantive family law remains a matter for the Member States, given the increasing mobility and internationalization of the child and the family, contemporary European law, within the limits of its competences, is developing certain mechanisms for harmonizing national family law solutions. Students gain knowledge on the development, obstacles and reaches of these mechanisms.
