1.1. Course objectives

The course aims to provide students with a comprehensive understanding of EU State Aid Law, its legal framework, and its practical implications. Upon completion of the course, students will be able to:

- 7. Evaluate the role of national courts in enforcing State Aid rules and the recovery of unlawful aid.
- 8. Develop critical thinking skills through the analysis of real-life cases, European Commission decisions, and academic discussions on State Aid policy.
- 9. Apply State Aid rules to practical scenarios and assess their impact on competition and economic development.
